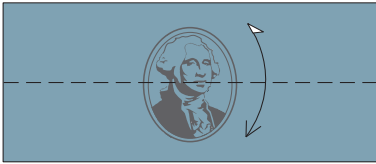
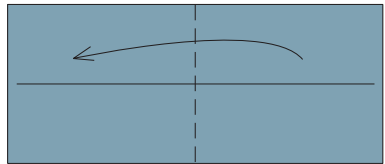


Snail

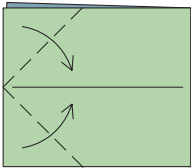
The twist sequence is one of my favorites, and making a snail provides a great excuse to use it. A single long flap is locked into itself while forming a spiral. The rest of the folds are fairly standard, except for the final step. Here you get to exercise your artistry by rounding out the body using soft folds.



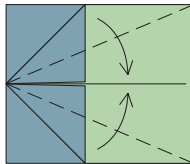
1 Precrease in half.



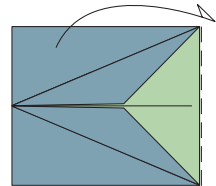
2 Valley fold in half.



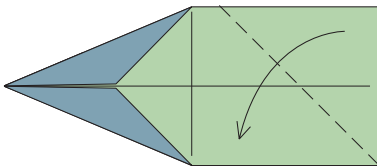
3 Valley fold the corners to the center.



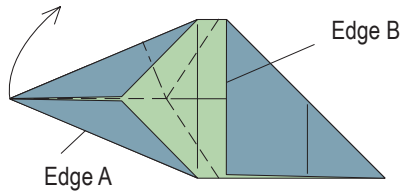
4 Valley fold the sides toward the center.



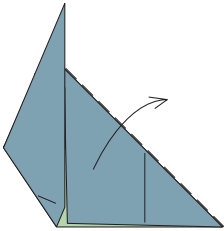
5 Open out along the center.



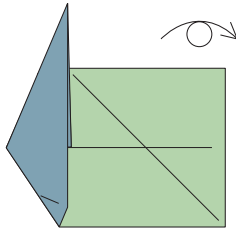
6 Valley fold toward the bottom edge.



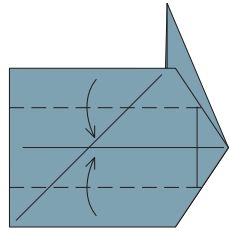
7 Rabbit ear the flap, so that edge A meets edge B.



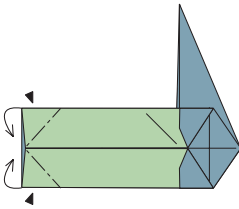
8 Unfold the flap.



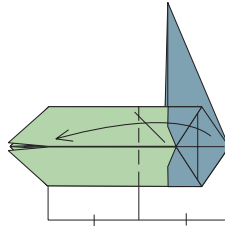
9 Turn over.



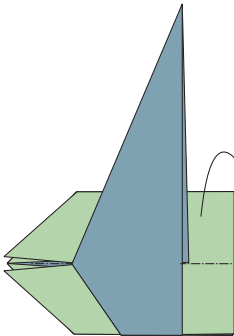
10 Valley fold the sides to the center.



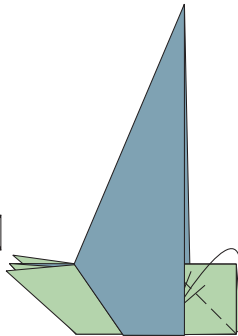
11 Reverse fold the corners.



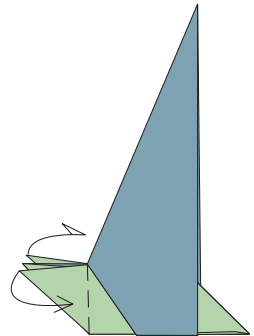
12 Valley fold along the indicated halfway point.



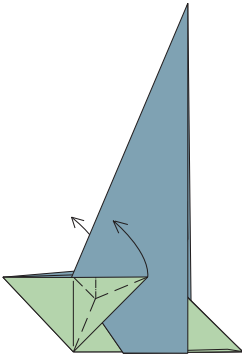
13 Mountain fold in half.



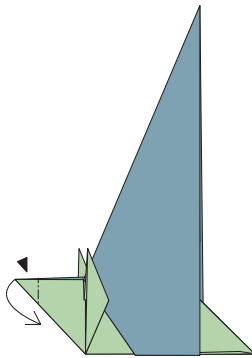
14 Tuck the corner into the pocket.



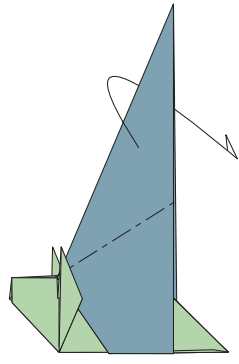
15 Swing over the two side flaps.



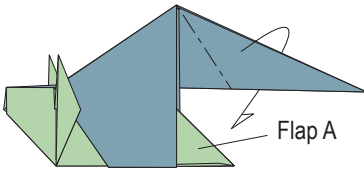
16 Rabbit ear the flaps up.



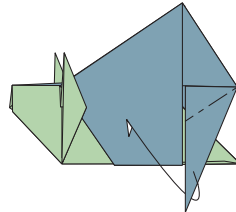
17 Reverse fold the corner about one-third of the flap's length.



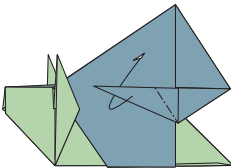
18 Mountain fold the long flap.



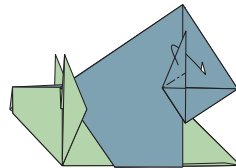
19 Mountain fold the flap, resting it on top of flap A.



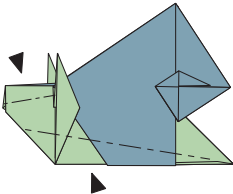
20 Mountain fold the flap towards the left.



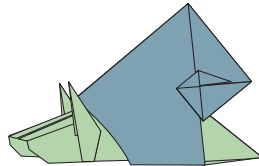
21 Mountain fold the flap up.
